
## 7 "Days" Transform the Earth (Genesis 1, 2)






## 2 (15 Minutes) The Exodus

- 20. Centuries later Jehovah saves Moses and he is raised in Pharaoh's house, but flees to Midian. God uses him to free the nation of Israel from slavery in Egypt with 10 plagues and drowns their army. Exadus 1-15
- 21. God feeds Israel on manna in the wilderness and Moses' father-in-law, Jethro the priest of Midian, helps Moses to judge the people. Jehovah offers to make Israel into a kingdom of priests if they obey. Exadus 16-19

## The Passover Celebration (Exadus 12-13)

On the night of Moses' 10th plague on Egypt the Israelites were told to kill a lamb and eat it roasted with bitter herbs and unleavened bread, then to put its blood on the door frames of their houses to prevent Jehovah from killing their own firstborn inside.

This pictured the sacrifice of Jesus for our sins and is embodied in the Lord's Supper.

### **The Golden Rule**

- 23. God has Israel build the Tabernacle with the **Ark of the Covenant** and gives over 600 laws. The priests are consecrated. Leviticus 1-27, Numbers 1-9
- 24. Moses brother-in-law, Hobab, is a guide for Israel and fathers the Kenites. Numbers 10-12
- 25. Israel sends 12 men to spy on Canaan but is afraid to trust God to take it. So Israel is cursed to wander for 40 years. Numbers 13-14
- 26. God kills Korah and 250 rebels. Numbers 13-20

## The Priestly Blessing (Numbers 6)


Jehovah bless you and keep you. Jehovah make His face shine on you and be gracious to you. Jehovah turn His face toward you and give you peace.

- 27.Edom opposes Israel so they go around them and defeat kings Sihon and Og and take their land. God saves Israel with a **Serpent-on-a-Pole**. Numbers 20-21
- 28. King Balak of Moab pays the prophet Balaam to seduce Israel with sex idolatry so that Jehovah will curse them, but God delivers Israel and *curses*Moab, Edom and Amalek instead. Numbers 22-35
- 29. The Book of Deuteronomy
  The farewell sermon of Moses across the Jordan river from Jericho. Israel is to love Jehovah their God and obey His commandments. Israel is to destroy Canaan's idolatry and have only one place of worship. Israel will have a future king but he is not to seek Egyptian things, many wives or wealth, but instead to seek God's Law. God will bring a future Prophet who must be obeyed like Moses. When they cross the Jordan river Ephraim, Judah, Manasseh, Benjamin, Levi, Simeon and Issachar must bless Israel from Mt Gerizim as Reuben, Gad, Dan, Asher, Naphtali and Zebulun curse Israel if they turn apostate from Mt Ebal. Israel renews their covenant and Joshua of Ephraim is made their leader. Future apostasy is foretold as the Song of Moses warns. Moses goes to die on Mt Nebo and curses Reuben but blesses the other tribes and Joseph, Levi, Judah and Benjamin the most.

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
- 51. God has Samuel secretly anoint young David of Judah to be Israel's next king and he kills the giant Goliath. 1 Samuel 16-18
- 52-53. Jealous Saul tries to kill David so he must flee to live with his gang. 15amuel 19-22
- 54-55. David spares Saul's life twice while being hunted down by him but must finally flee to live by the Philistines for safety. 1 Samuel 23-27
- 56. The Philistines defeat Israel and kill Saul as David tries to help Israel. I Samuel 28-30
- 57. The tribe of **Judah makes David their king in Hebron** while Abner sets Saul's son Ish-Bosheth up in Mahanaim as the king of the other tribes. 2 Samuel 12.5




- 58-59. Ish-Bosheth is assassinated so then all of the tribes of Israel make David their king. David makes Jerusalem in the tribe of Benjamin the capital city of Israel. 2 Samuel 3-5,1 Chronicles 11
- 60. David wants to build a Temple for the Ark. <u>God</u> <u>promises his dynasty will be eternal.</u> 2 Samuel 6-7
- 61. David conquers and subdues all of the other nations around up to the Euphrates River. 2 Samuel 8
- 62. David sins with Bathsheba and the prophet Nathan exposes him and foretells *trouble coming* on David's family for this. 2 Samuel 9-12
- 63. David repents but is attacked in a coup led by his own son Absalom and 20,000 die. 2 Samuel 12-19
- 64. The northern tribes split away from David for a while but then accept him back as king. David's life is saddened by his great sin. 2 Samuel 20-23





- 66. David takes a disastrous census and 70,000 people are killed. 2 Samuel 24,1 Chronicles 21
- 67. David makes Solomon the next king before his brother can usurp the throne. 1 Kings 1,2,15,1 Chronicles 22-29
- 68. Solomon builds the Temple and gets great wisdom and wealth to rule Israel. 1 Kings 2-8,10, 2 Chronicles 1-7



About 967 BC Solomon's 4<sup>th</sup> year was 480 years after Israel came out of Egypt. – I Kings B




83. Ahab is the next evil king of Israel. 1 Kings 16,21

- 89. Ahab's son Ahaziah is the next evil king of Israel and God wreaks a gold venture that he has with Jehoshaphat. God takes up Elijah and so Elisha replaces him. 1 Kings 19-22, 2 Kings 1-2, 2 Chronicles 20
- 90. Elisha saves the armies of Judah, Israel and Edom, and defeats Moab with desert pools. 2 Kings 3
- 91. Elisha saves a prophet's children from slavery with unending oil, resurrects a child, feeds 100 men with 20 loaves, stops poison and heals leprosy in Aram's general Naaman while putting it on his own servant Gehazi for greed. 2 Kings 4-6


- 92. Elisha reveals Aram's plans and traps their army. He foretells **God's rescue of Samaria**. He also foretells who will be **Aram's new king** and that **Aram will hurt Israel**. 2 Kings 6-8
- 93. Jehoshaphat's son Jehoram is the next king of Judah and marries Ahab's daughter queen Athaliah but dies of plague. 2 Kings 8, 2 Chronicles 21
- 94. Elisha has Jehu kill the king of Israel and he also kills the king of Judah too. 2 Kings 8-9, 2 Chronicles 22
- 95. Athalia rules Judah and kills the royal family but Joash is hidden in the Temple. 2 Kings 11, 2 Chronicles 22



96. Jehu massacres everyone associated with Ahab's dynasty and has Queen Jezebel thrown down to her death where dogs eat her. He and Jehonadab the Kenite kill all of the Baal worshippers at their temple in Samaria. Then Jehu starts a new dynasty in Israel but is not careful to worship Jehovah and soon resumes the evil practices of Jeroboam. 2 Kings 9-10

- 97. Athalia ruins the Temple using its vessels for Baal. She is killed. Joash is made the next king of Judah at age 7 and fixes the Temple. 2 Kings II-I2, 2 Chronicles 23-24
- 98. Jehovah grants **Jehu a 4-generation dynasty** and his son Jehoahaz is made the next king of Israel but **Aram makes Israel wretched**. 2 Kings 13
- 99. King Joash turns away from God and kills priest Zechariah, but is assassinated. 2 Kings 12-13, 2 Chronicles 24
- 100. Joash's son Amaziah is the next king of Judah. Elisha has Israel beat Aram. 2 Kings 13-14, 2 Chronicles 25
- 101. Amaziah hires men of Israel who loot Judah. He defeats Edom but worships its gods. 2 Kings 14, 2 Chronicles 25
- 102. Jeroboam II is made the next king of Israel. Uzziah is the next king of Judah. 2 Kings 14-15, 2 Chronicles 25-26



103. <u>The Book of Amos</u> Written before the great earthquake of King Uzziah. *Assyria and Egypt will punish Israel* and *God will use drought and* earthquake. Jehovah wants justice and not just festivals, offerings and songs. *Doom to the Bethel shrine* and to those only living for pleasure and ignoring the poor. <u>Jehovah is in the affairs of all nations</u>. Israel will be destroyed but Judah will be restored.



107. The Book of Hosea Hosea marries a whore to show God's relation with Israel. Jehu's dynasty will be punished for the massacre he performed. Israel and Judah will reunite after being purged of their Baal orgies and view Jehovah as a husband and not as a Master (Baal). The priests have perverted everyone in Israel at the sex shrines in Bethel and Gilgal. A locust plague is coming. Israel's new kings seek Assyrian help against Judah so Israel will end up in exile in Assyria and Egypt. Jehovah's heartfelt compassion is stirred up over Israel's coming doom and Judah is no better. Israel is sacrificing babies to Baal so now Israel's enemies will kill their babies and pregnant women. Long ago they demanded that God give them a king but now He demands that their kingdom must come to an end. Jehovah pleads one last time for Israel to return to Him before it is too late.





- 113. The Book of Isaiah (Chapter 1-6) Reason with God for your sins to be forgiven. All nations will come to Jehovah's Temple and not learn war anymore. God wants justice but Israel calls evil good. Isaiah has a vision of Jehovah in the Temple and is sent to warn blind Israel.
- 114. Jotham is the next good king in Judah 2 Kings 15, 2 Chronicles 27
- 115. The Book of Micah (Chapter 1-2) Israel's sex and religion sin is so incurable that *Israel must now be destroyed*, and it has spread now to Judah also. Israel only wants sermons on prosperity but not the truth.

- 152. The Book of Jeremiah (Chapter 27-31,51) Judah's exile will last 70 years. A New Covenant. Israel and Judah will serve Jehovah's King from David's line. A harvest will come from Samaria but Rachel will weep for the children of Bethlehem. The Medes will conquer Babylon.
- 153. The Book of Ezekiel (Chapter 1-25) Ezekiel sees a vision of Jehovah above wheels-in-wheels with 4 creatures and gives warnings. He lays for 430 days by a model of Jerusalem for its sin and sees God's glory leave the Temple for Mt Olives and Zedekiah blinded and sent to Babylon. Judah is worse than Sodom. A New Covenant will atone for evil. People must account for their own sin but God delights if they turn to do good. Ezekiel laments Josiah's Queen Hamutal whose 2 kingly sons will be exiled (Jehoahaz and Zedekiah). Egypt perverted Israel and Judah. As Israel (Oholah) lusted for Assyria who killed her, so too Judah (Oholibah) lusted for Babylon who will kill her also. Ezekiel proclaims Jerusalem is under siege.









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## (10 Minutes) The Return of the Jews to Judea and Exiles Remaining in Persia

165. The Book of Daniel (Chapter 5-9) 4 beasts representing kingdoms are followed by God giving the "Son-of-man" all nations to rule forever. Angel Gabriel says the Greeks (goat) will beat the Medes and Persians (ram). God writes on a wall that Babylon will fall to the Medes and Persians that very night. Daniel is thrown to the lions but God saves him. Daniel reads Jeremiah's prophecy of 70 years of exile and Angel Gabriel says there are 70 x 7 from the order to rebuild Jerusalem until sacrifices end, the Anointed One is cut off, a covenant is confirmed, and the city and the Temple will be destroyed.



196. The Sermon on the Mount Crowds from far and wide seek healing and Jesus takes them to a mountainside and teaches them The Beatitudes. He tells them that blessed are those who are seeking and suffering for God. His disciples are to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Jesus explains that He will fulfill all of the prophesies that have been made of Him in the scriptures and warns them that anger, like murder, leads to Gehenna. His disciples are to maintain marital fidelity, be honest, endure injustice and love their enemies without hypocrisy. They are to seek first the Kingdom of God, and all of their other needs will be met. Jesus teaches them how to pray with The Lord's Prayer and to fast without ostentation. He assures them that God cares, so they can be generous without worry, keep their eye simple and themselves full of light, and store up treasure in heaven. He warns against hypocritically judging others and not seeing one's own faults. They must persist in prayer believing the Father will give good things to His children. The way to life is narrow and few find it, but the way to destruction is wide and many go in that direction. The disciples must beware of false prophets with evil fruit and realize that many false disciples will arise doing powerful works that Jesus will disown. Jesus says that if you put His words into practice you will be able to endure the storms of life. Matthew 5-7, Luke B

241. The Pharisees and Sadducees ask trick questions to try to trap Jesus, until He asks them to explain how David's Son can be his "Lord" in Psalm 110. Matthew 22. Mark 12. Luke 20

242. In Jesus' **last public speech** He calls the Pharisees hypocrites. Matthew 23, Mark 12, Luke 20



243. The Discourse on Mt Olives Jesus says when leaving the Temple that it will be destroyed, so Peter, James, John and Andrew ask Him privately on Mount Olives when this will happen and what sign there will be of its approach to bring the end of the age. He warns them that deceivers, wars, earthquakes and famines are only the beginning of distress. The disciples will experience hatred and tribulation. But before the end comes all nations must first hear the Good News of the Kingdom. God's Spirit will help the disciples when they are brought before governors and kings. Then Jesus warns them to flee from Jerusalem when they see the city being besieged and the abomination causing desolation standing in the holy place, as prophesied by Daniel, because the Gentiles will crush Jerusalem and the Temple, but the Son-of-man will come in glory. He tells them to be watchful although the world won't pay heed (Faithful and Wise Servant). The faithful will be rewarded but the evil will be punished (Servants Investing Wealth). Be wise and ready instead of foolish and unprepared (The 10 Virgins). The Son-of-man will judge all of the nations (The Sheep and the Goats). Matthew 24-25, Mark 13, Luke 21



## 10 (15 Minutes) The Early Acts of the Apostles

265. After 10 days <u>the Holy Spirit empowers 120 disciples to speak in tongues</u> to those in Jerusalem attending Pentecost from **throughout the Roman Empire and beyond** and **3,000 are baptized.** They **meet daily in the Temple** and **grow in numbers.** Acts 1-2







274. The Gospel of Matthew (To the Jews - prophecies fulfilled) Notes women God used before Mary, shows Jesus was born in Bethlehem and how He came to Nazareth. John the Baptist endorsed Him. Tells The Sermon on the Mount, tells of healing and casting out demons and the 12 Apostles. Jesus is above the Sabbath and His sign of Jonah resurrection proves His authority. The Kingdom of God is seen in Jesus' power and transfiguration. Jesus' Discourse on Mt Olives warns Jews to flee Jerusalem's coming destruction. Jesus' trial, death, burial and resurrection, and Great Commission to all nations.



275. **Herod kills James** and plans to kill Peter for the Jews but an angel releases Peter and God kills Herod. *The Holy Spirit picks Paul and Barnabas for special work.* Acts 12-13

276. Paul, Barnabas and Mark take the Gospel throughout **Cyprus** and governor Sergius Paulus believes. Then they sail to Perga but Mark returns to Jerusalem. Acts 4,13



## 11 (20 Minutes) The Second Journey of Paul

281. Paul's Letter to the Galatians (Disturbed by Judaizers) Stop listening to those who add requirements to God's grace. There is only one Gospel and Jesus Himself revealed it to Paul. Paul and Barnabas even got the agreement of the Apostles on this, but once Paul had to rebuke even Peter in Antioch, and Barnabas too on this. It was faith that led to salvation and will keep it, and not keeping the Law. The Law enslaves but life by the Holy Spirit leads to true freedom from sin. Let God's Spirit work in you.

282. Barnabas and Mark go to Cyprus. Paul and Silas visit disciples in cities from the first journey with the Apostles' Ruling. Timothy joins them and

Paul circumcises him to avoid offending Jews. Luke joins them too and God sends them to Macedonia. Acts 15-16






288. Many become disciples at Corinth but the Jews stir up a mob against Paul. Acts 18

Apostasy and the Lawless One, who will exult himself in God's Temple as god over everything worshipped, must come first when the restraint is removed. This evil one will display power through signs and wonders in accordance with Satan, and God will send a powerful delusion on those who delight in wickednes

- 290. Aguila and Priscilla stay at Ephesus. Paul returns to Jerusalem and Antioch. Acts 18
- 291. Aguila and Priscilla mentor Apollos who defends the Gospel at Corinth. Acts 18

## The Third Journey of Paul

292. Paul returns to Ephesus and baptizes 12 disciples in the Holy Spirit who speak in **Tongues**. Paul teaches the Gospel to all of Asia for 2 years at the school of Tyrannus. Acts 18-19





- 293. Demons beat Jewish exorcists but fear Jesus. Disciples burn sorcery books. Acts 19
- 294. Paul visits Corinth and writes from Ephesus. Acts 19,1 Corinthians 1,4,5,7,16,2 Corinthians 13,16, Romans 16

295. Paul's Letter of 1st Corinthians (2nd letter on Problems) All must be united. Keep faith simple and rely on God's Spirit instead of philosophy. Expel a man sleeping with his stepmother and stop the spread of immorality. Settle your problems out of court. Marriage is for sexual relations but singleness has benefits. Don't harm other's conscience with our freedom. Recognize the sanctity of the Lord's Supper. God's Holy Spirit gives supernatural gifts for all to work unitedly as a body but unless everything is done in love it's all of no use. Seek all of God's spiritual gifts but especially those that help others and use them at meetings for the benefit of all. Reject skeptics who deny the resurrection, realizing that if Christ is still dead then our faith is futile. When Christ returns we will be raised up in imperishable bodies, and then the end will come when He hands over the Kingdom to God the Father and death is destroyed

296. Demetrius the silversmith stirs up a riot in Ephesus over loss of business at the temple of Artimus and Paul thinks they might be killed but God saves them. He meets Titus in Macedonia to see how the disciples at Corinth received his letter and hears



297. Paul's Letter of 2nd Corinthians (Encouragement) Forgive and now help the man that they expelled for sleeping with his stepmother because of his repentance. Handling the message of Jesus bears great responsibility as we now deal directly with God, unlike the Jewish Law. Help Titus get a relief offering ready for Paul's visit. Paul warns against the arrogance of the Jewish visitors belittling him. Paul has credentials but trusts in God's power to work through his weakness rather than in his human ability. Paul will deal with this situation when he arrives in Corinth.



298. Paul goes to Corinth for 3 months. Acts 20,22, 2 Corinthians 10-11, Romans 15



299. Paul's Letter to the Romans (Trusting God) God gives life to those having faith in Him but darkness and evil come from suppressing the truth and ignoring God, whose invisible qualities are clearly seen from the things He has made. All men fall under sin's power alike and Jesus is God's only way out. We must have faith. Serving sin earns us only death, but God has made a gift of life to us through Jesus. God's Spirit in us gives us power to overcome sin. Israel stumbled as foretold but God uses this to bring Jews and Gentiles together in Jesus.

## **God Gives Us Eternal Life Through Jesus Christ**

(Romans 3): All people sin and fall short of God's commands. (Romans 6): Sin earns death for all of us. (Romans 6): Life is God's gift to us through Jesus Christ. (Romans 5): Only Jesus Christ can make us right with God. (Romans 1D): We must believe in Jesus Christ and declare it. (Romans 5): Peace with God can only come through Jesus. (Romans 8): There is no condemnation when we're in Christ. (Romans 8): There is no separation from God's love in Christ. 
## The First Imprisonment of Paul in Rome

- 301. Agabus warns Paul at Philip's home of trouble ahead. Paul is falsely arrested in the Temple while helping with a vow and protected from the Jews by Romans. Acts 21-22
- 302. Then Jesus tells Paul that he must testify about Him in Rome and the Romans move Paul to Caesarea to protect him from a plot by Jews to kill him. Acts 22-23

- 303. Paul is in jail for 2 years in Caesarea while governor Felix waits for a bribe. Acts 24
- 304. Governor Festus tries to hand Paul to the Jews so he appeals to Rome. Acts 25-26
- 305. Paul is shipwrecked on the way to Rome and spends 2 years in jail there. Acts 27-28
- 306. The Gospel of Luke (Part 1 of Paul's court defense in Rome) This is reliable research into Jesus' genealogy, relation to John the Baptist, prophecy-fulfilling ministry, authority and life-changing message. A centurion has faith. Jesus heals, casts out demons and resurrects Jews and Gentiles. He picked Apostles. He miraculously fed 5,000 people and was transfigured in glory. All men are neighbors. Give both Caesar and God their due. Jesus foretold the coming destruction of Jerusalem. Pilate rejected charges of rebellion and yet crucified Jesus. Jesus was resurrected, ascended and sent the Holy Spirit.
- **307.** Acts of the Apostles (Part 2 of Paul's court defense in Rome) This is continued from Luke. The growing number of disciples in Jerusalem is explained and the events surrounding the persecution and scattering of Jesus' disciples. God's choosing of non-Jews to be disciples and the spread of the disciples throughout the empire is explained. Paul's arrest is recounted and he is now awaiting his trial in Rome.

- 309. Paul's Letter to the Colossians (Keep Jesus preeminent) God rescued us from darkness and put us into the Kingdom of His beloved Son. All things in heaven and earth were made through and for the Son and He sustains them. Beware of bondage through adding deceptive philosophy to the news of Jesus.
- **310.** Paul's Letter to Philemon (Indebted to Jesus) Welcome Onesimus back as a beloved brother and not just as a runaway slave. Paul expects to be released soon and will visit Philemon at Colossae.
- 311. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians (God's Glorious Plan) God is richly blessing us through Jesus in whom all things in heaven and earth will be brought into unity just as God had always planned.
- 312. Epaphroditus brings Paul a gift in jail and takes back a letter from Paul. Philippians I
- 313. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (Be like Jesus) The news of Jesus spread to the palace and guard from his jail. Humbly love others like Jesus did, who emptied Himself of God's form to serve us








- 315. <u>Letter to the Hebrews</u> (Jesus is greater than Moses) God spoke through His own Son, through whom He made all things and to whom He gives them to sustain. Jesus is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of His very being, and is far above the angels who worship Him. <u>Jesus is our new High Priest after the order of Melchizedek</u> who can sympathize with us through what He suffered and ministers the New Sabbath and New Covenant. <u>Jewish worship prefigured the realities in Jesus</u>.
- 316. Paul leaves Timothy as the leader at Ephesus and goes to Macedonia. 1 Timothy 1,3
- 317. Paul's 1st Letter to Timothy (Shepherd-leadership) Protect Ephesus against false teachings like Hymenaeus and Alexander introduced. Pray for rulers to rule well so all may hear about Jesus. The Spirit clearly says that in later times some will abandon the faith to follow demonic deception and teachings.
- 318. Paul may have gone to Spain. He leaves Titus as the leader in Crete. Romans 15, Titus 1
- 319. Paul's Letter to Titus (Appoint leaders) Disciples must respect the rulers and live peaceably.
- 320. Peter sends an urgent letter to the disciples exiled after Rome burns. 2 Timothy 4,1 Peter 5
  - **321.** <u>Peter's 1st Letter</u> (To the exiles in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia and Bithynia) Trials refine us. We are living stones built on Jesus to be God's Temple. Willingly suffer for doing good like Jesus.

Peter confesses that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and Jesus is transfigured in glory. <u>Jesus foretold</u> the coming destruction of Jerusalem.
- 323. Paul winters at Nicopolis near Rome. Titus 3, 2 Timothy 4
  - **324.** <u>Peter's 2nd Letter</u> (Peter's farewell) <u>Peter is about to die.</u> Stand fast for Jesus. <u>Predatory teachers are rising up among the disciples.</u> <u>Things will get worse before the New Heavens and New Earth arrive.</u>
- 325. Paul is jailed again in Rome. Disciples of Asia have abandoned him. 2 Timothy 1,2,4
  - 326. Paul's 2nd Letter to Timothy (Paul's farewell) Keep speaking up for Jesus and Paul. If we deny God He will deny us. Things will get worse but trust God. Paul is about to die but his reward is ahead.
- 327. The Letter of Jude (Urgent warning) Beware of predatory teachers rising up among disciples.



### The Christians after the Romans Sack Jerusalem up to the Death of John

### **Eusebius on John at Patmos and Ephesus**

John used "Word" to refer to Jesus at Revelation 19:11-16, 1 John 1:1-4 and John 1:1-18 in 96-98 AD at Patmos and Ephesus, like Genesis 1. "Word" was used in philosophy at Ephesus in 480 BC under Persia in Queen Esther's day and in 55 AD Paul reflected on the philosophers of Acts 17:16-34 in 1 Corinthians 1:18-24 and 2 Corinthians 4:1-4. Then in 61 AD he wrote about it to disciples near Ephesus in Colossians 1:15-23, Ephesians 1:3-14/3:4-21, and Hebrews 1.
